- It is the only nonprofit that provides certified data destruction and electronics recycling services in New England. We provide this service to recover reusable computers for use in our mission.
- Since our inception in 2002, we've provided low and no cost personal computers, training and support for more than 14,000 people in need all over New England.
- Businesses participating in our recycling program benefit by externalizing all their end of life IT management work to us, while allowing reuse of their retired tech to help others.

How bad is the digital isolation problem?

- Over thirty percent of Americans do not have access to a computer, the Internet or the skills to compete in the 21st century economy. That's more than 300,000 people in Maine alone.
- This impacts literacy, education, information access, gainful employment, aging in place...
- Helping people obtain these skills and resources is called 'Digital Inclusion' and is our mission.
